


#### Daily Reported New Positive COVID-19 Tests vs. Daily Reported Deaths from COVID-19 in the U.S.





#### COVID-19 Deaths by Age vs. Share of Population in the U.S.






The CDC estimates that **for every reported positive** COVID-19 test there are another 11 other COVID-19 infections, with an estimated range from 6 to 24.2

This would mean 41.4 million to 165.6 million people in the US have been infected with COVID-19 with the best guess being 75.9 million people or 23% of the population.<sup>3</sup>
